#### Retail Information

An important commercial corridor in the Ballpark neighborhood is North Larimer Street. From 20th Street all the way to the northern edge of Downtown, Larimer Street offers a unique mix of buildings and tenants--pawn shops, jazz clubs, bars, antique shops, art framers, galleries, brewpubs, authentic Mexican restaurants, small office tenants and more. Five Points is more widely known as the busy retail, restaurant and services corridor on Welton Street, which bustles with 75 businesses, including restaurants, cafes, boutique shops, barber shops, salons and other retailers. A bank, radio station, bottled water distributor and a busy Denver motor vehicle licensing office are other tenants. Welton Street is the only predominantly African-American owned commercial strip in the country.

#### Office Market

Curtis Park's landmarks include the Denver Enterprise Center, an innovative small-business incubator that utilizes the labor force from the surrounding neighborhood; the Women's Bean Project, an entrepreneurial business and job skills program for low-income women; and Sacred Heart, Denver's oldest Catholic parish whose church recently completed significant renovations. The average office rental rate is \$16.58/SF and the occupancy for the area is 86% as of mid-year 2004.

## Neighborhood Profile

These neighborhoods lie to the north of Downtown Denver. The southern end of the neighborhood is anchored by Coors Field. The boundary also stretches almost 20 blocks to the north from 20th Street, into a section of Downtown that is still very much a functioning warehouse and light industry district. An increasing number of those warehouses are being renovated into loft projects. Area cultural events and amenities include; the Ballpark Market, Juneteenth celebration, the AT&T LoDo Music Festival, the Black American West Museum, Five Points Media Center, Roundtree Art Center and the Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble studios.
